CONSERVATION

Wilton Wildlife Preserve & Park works with our partners to support a wide range of conservation efforts in the Saratoga Sandplains. Our partners, our Environmental Education and Conservation Interns, and our volunteers had a great year with many accomplishments:

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

We work with schools and groups from Saratoga County and beyond providing in-school and after-school programs as well as hosting field trips at Camp Saratoga. In the summer, we visit Gavin Park and other summer camp programs and host visits to Camp Saratoga.

Group programs are just one part of what we do. For the public, we offer nature walks and talks, pond explorations and craft programs year-round. During the two broods of the Karner blue butterfly, we have guided walks to educate about our best known species! We have an annual Wildlife Festival and bring our exhibits and hands-on activities to many community events and festivals.

We are able to do so much in the area of environmental education through our internship program which gives recent college graduates real work experience while nurturing the next generation of environmental professionals!

In 2017 we worked collaboratively with many organizations to take our message out to the community including; 4H, BOCES, Colonie Youth Center; Franklin Community Center's Project Lift, Gavin Park, Moreau Lake State Park, the Prevention Council, the Saratoga Springs Public Library, Skidmore College Environmental Studies students, and Washington County Important Bird Area.

OUTDOOR RECREATION

We work closely with our partners in maintaining existing trails, creating new trails and linkages, and improving opportunities for people to get out and enjoy nature. Visitors can go for a nature walk, go bird watching, enjoy photographing nature, walk their dogs, go for a fitness run, snowshoe, cross country ski, and more! We have over 20 miles of trails for people to enjoy. In 2017 the Town of Wilton installed a new water and septic system that allowed for the installation of flush toilets near the trailhead at Camp Saratoga North; a very exciting and appreciated addition to the amenities at Camp Saratoga! Improvements were also made around the camping area and lean-tos by the Historic Cornell Hill Fire Tower.

2017 also saw some new trail projects being planned. These will be known as the Town of Wilton Bicentennial Trail and will include linking Camp Saratoga to the Edie Road trails and a trail for horses along Scout Road.

Our commitment to year-round outdoor recreation includes our winter trail grooming program at Camp Saratoga North. Our popular Moonlight Ski and Snowshoe event was cancelled in 2017 due to lack of the necessary conditions.

The Saratoga Stryders running club is a great partner, holding a series of 5k fun runs in the summer and an 8k snowshoe race in the winter.

As with all of our events, our volunteers made it all possible! Thanks to Ballston Spa National Bank for their sponsorship support of the live animal programs.




SIXTH ANNUAL PHOTOGRAPHY SHOW




